# **Personal Development Week**

A reminder to parents that our enrichment activities are on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> July. Year 10 will take part in work related learning with work shadowing and mock interviews/English speaking assessments for GCSE. Years 7-9 take part in a range of on-site activities in addition to trips and visits to enrich and develop their character, as well as developing teamwork, independence and increase their cultural capital. I will be going in to assemblies to speak with the year 7, 8 and 9 students about the range of activities both in-school and off-site.

Parents of year 7 students will not be familiar with this but parents of year 8 and 9 will recall that these days are 'own clothes days' and we change the school timetable just for these two days. Each year group has a choice of trips which include trips up into London and trips such as Chessington. I am delighted to announce that we have trips available to Chessington for every year group this year. As you might expect, some of these trips book out very quickly. There are many ways in which we have tried to make this as fair as possible for booking, so we try and do this after work, rather than during school time to allow parents to book trips. Everything is booked through ParentPay and will be done on a first-come, first served basis. We will give parents reminders as to when the trips will be opened with a date and a time. Trips are often much cheaper than going to the venue on your own so provide good value for money, so please do try something different.

The activities that we run in school as well as the subsidised trips come at a cost to the school. Each year we ask for a voluntary core contribution to help provide visiting guests such as the martial arts training, bouncy castle assault courses, the resources for team-building and the like. We appreciate that we are all looking after the wallets and purses more these days, which is why we have kept that core contribution at £8 for the 2 days, which supports all of the memorable work that students get involved with. Do take a look at some of the images on our social media pages from last July. It was a time that memories were made.
