# R8 bus service

Many parents would have seen an increased staff presence outside the school, in particular for the R8 bus service. There had been a couple of days before Christmas where 70-80 students were queuing for a 'hopper' style single decker bus service that can carry only around 30 passengers. Over recent weeks, to support the safety of students onto and during the service up to Main Road, Biggin Hill, staff have been operating a system where the numbers in the queue are limited to 30 to support this safe approach. Please do not be surprised if there is already a queue and students are told that there is not room on the bus. If there is a specific need, this will always be taken into consideration, but the walk up to the Main Road is only 700m.

# ParentPay canteen payments

Did you know you can set up an alert on ParentPay to notify you when your son/daughter's balance is running low?

On the page that shows the balances for each person, underneath your current balance is the option to "Set up low balance alerts". You can then select which amount you want to be notified on, e.g. £5 and then you can select whether you want to be notified by text or e-mail. This will help students to avoid going to the till with food and having no money left in their account to pay for their food.

You can also see what you son/daughter has bought every day by looking at "lunchtime meal activity" at the bottom of the home page.
