Oxford University Trip

On the last day of half term a group of year 10 students were invited to Oxford University through our partnerships with one of the larger colleges; Mansfield College. We have a long standing partnership with Oxford through our belief that with effort and hard work, students can achieve entry to the best universities in the country.

The day consisted of an introduction to the college and tutorial system at Oxford, from their admissions officer and current students. This was followed by a tour of the college including the beautiful libraries. Students then enjoys lunch in the college restaurant which resembled something from Hogwarts, where students and leading lecturers from Oxford University dine together.

The afternoon was a lecture from Dr James Munro – which was an introduction to Repetition and Chaos Theory. The lecture was pitched as it would be for year 3 undergraduates but generated interesting discussions around the mathematical world of chaos theory.

Students can get the opportunity to visit a range of universities through our links with AIM Higher and our deep partnerships with local universities. Many students will choose university as a route to a particular career or aspiration. In addition to the fascinating knowledge and experiences for the students, there was a clear message that university can be affordable to so many more families through loans, bursaries and scholarships.

On Friday 23rd February during P3 we enjoyed our third DEAR [Drop Everything and Read] session of this academic year. In order to promote reading for pleasure, everyone had the chance to stop and read for twenty minutes. Thank you to everyone who took part – and please keep reading! Remember:

- * Children who read books more than once a week gain higher results in GCSEs across all subjects than those who read less regularly.
- 16-year-olds who choose to read books for pleasure outside of school are more likely to secure managerial or <u>professional jobs</u> in later life.
- * Studies have found that reading for pleasure enhances empathy, understanding of the self, and the ability to understand one's own and others' identities.
- Regular readers for pleasure reported fewer feelings of stress and depression than non-readers, and stronger feelings of relaxation from reading than from watching television or engaging with technology intensive activities.

Also in school, feel free to take part in:

- Book Club with Mrs Lamb every Thursday lunch time.
