# Enrichment Week - Year 7,8 and 9

We have had either a very restricted or no Enrichment Week since the start of the pandemic so students at Key Stage 3 have not experienced the end of term arrangements before.

In the last week of term we drop the normal timetabled lessons and have a focus on Personal Development across 5 themes; Leadership, Organisation, Communication, Initiative and Resilience. Staff work very hard to plan and take trips and visits to London and the South East and yet further afield with cultural trips into Europe. We feel that these visits are valuable for students to gain skills outside of the classroom as well as developing what we call 'cultural capital' or the understanding of the wider world around. For students in school, a wide range of activities take place during the school day. Students are in non-uniform too!

Over the course of the first part of the half term, from Easter onwards, we will be writing home to share the experiences with families, so that they can book onto these trips. All trips are on a first come, first served basis and will be different for each year group. We will request a voluntary contribution of £6 per student. This will help fund activities and the majority will be taken off the cost of booking the trips. As with everything, the price rises due to post-pandemic inflation and fuel/transport costs mean that some of the trips may have been a little more expensive than in the past, but we are usually able to negotiate good rates for schools, making this much cheaper than booking events as families.

This year we plan a number of trips to include: Theme Park, a day visit to France, Outdoor Ski Centre, Houses of Parliament, Kew Gardens, Battle of Hastings, Olympic Park, various London Museums and a boat trip along the Thames. Some of these trips are free and we encourage as many families to book onto these experiences as possible. Further details to follow!

# Free Online Safety Guide What parents need to know about Yubo

With an estimated user-base of 50 million, Yubo (previously known as Yellow) might be the biggest social media platform you've never heard of. Unless, of course, you caught last month's *Sunday Times* investigation – in which an undercover journalist posed as a 15-year-old girl on the app, receiving requests for hook-ups, demands for nude images and threats of sexual violence.

As if that were not alarming enough, Yubo also enables strangers to watch children's live video streams – while granting the app access to their device's GPS tracker reveals a young person's exact location. **The National Online Safety Guide** attached to this week's Link has a thorough breakdown of everything that trusted adults ought to know about Yubo.
