On Monday Year 8 took part in a Growth Mindset day. Characteristics associated with growth mindset include a willingness to confront challenges, viewing failure as a springboard for growth, and a passion for learning. Not surprisingly, this type of mindset is strongly linked to greater happiness and achievement in life.

We all have beliefs about our own abilities and potential. These beliefs are part of our mindset which is so powerful, it can fuel our behaviour and predict our success. Mindset shapes our everyday lives, helping us interpret our experiences and future possibilities.

Developing the right mindset early on is crucial. When students know their brains are capable of growing, amazing things can happen and this is what happened on Monday. The pictures show what an improvement was made from one drawing to another when our Year 8's believed they



could improve. Students were given a picture to copy, they did this four times however between each attempt they took upon feedback from their peers. This allowed them to develop and progress from their starting point. Alongside this activity, students practised the concept of growth mindset where rubbers were banned to emphasise that making mistakes is the building block to learning.

Growth mindset occurred when our students believed their intelligence and abilities could be improved upon with effort and the right strategies. A great day had by all with a lesson learnt that will help our students reach their potential.
