Welcome Back

A very warm welcome back to all students after the Easter break. I hope all students enjoyed the break and have returned refreshed for the summer term. A good number of students attended the Easter revision sessions and those who I spoke to were really appreciative of the staff who gave up their time to support them.

Industrial Action - 27th April & 2nd May

I wrote to parents earlier this week regarding the two days of industrial action planned by the NEU to take place on Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May. Having discussed the situation with staff union representatives the school will only be open to Year 11 and Year 13 students, together with a small number of our most vulnerable students who will be contacted directly over the coming days. NEU are keen to reduce the impact of strike action on these year groups and we have agreed here at Charles Darwin that teachers of Year 11 and Year 13 students who are taking strike action will set work for their classes on Satchel One. Work will be directly related to the work they are currently doing.

Year 11 students must be in school by 9.15am for an assembly at 9.30am ahead of lessons or where teachers are not in they will be able to work through the work set by their teachers on Satchel One in a computer room where appropriate support will be provided. Attendance for Year 11 is compulsory and essential at this stage of their course.

Year 13 students should be in the Hub for 8.50am. Students will attend lessons where teachers are in and for other lessons students will be supervised in the Hub while they work through the work set by their teachers on Satchel One.

School will be closed to students in Years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 12. Teachers not taking strike action will be in school and will be leading live lessons via Teams or setting work via Satchel One. Students should access Satchel One at 8.30am to see the work for the day.

Full details of the arrangements are in my letter to parents which was sent out earlier today.

Please note that the Year 12/13 Finance exam will be going ahead on 2nd May.

Y10 Parents' Evening




