Industrial Action – 2nd May

As parents will be aware the next day of industrial action by the NEU will take place on Tuesday 2nd May. The arrangements will be the same as those for Thursday 27th April in that the school will only be open to Year 11 and Year 13 students, together with a small number of our most vulnerable students who have been contacted. NEU are keen to reduce the impact of strike action on these year groups and we have agreed here at Charles Darwin that teachers of Year 11 and Year 13 students who are taking strike action will set work for their classes on Satchel One. Work will be directly related to the work they are currently doing.

Year 11 students must be in school by 9.15am for an assembly at 9.30am ahead of lessons or where teachers are not in they will be able to work through the work set by their teachers on Satchel One in a computer room where appropriate support will be provided. Attendance for Year 11 is compulsory and essential at this stage of their course.

Year 13 students should be in the Hub for 8.50am. Students will attend lessons where teachers are in and for other lessons students will be supervised in the Hub while they work through the work set by their teachers on Satchel One.

School will be closed to students in Years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 12. Teachers not taking strike action will be in school and will be leading live lessons via Teams or setting work via Satchel One. Students should access Satchel One at 8.30am to see the work for the day.

Please note that the Year 12/13 Finance exam will go ahead on 2nd May.

Reading Corner at Charles Darwin

At Charles Darwin school we aim to develop a culture where reading is valued across the curriculum.

Our three priorities:

- Students will be given regular opportunities to read for enjoyment
- Wider reading will be encouraged where possible across all subject areas. [Staff across the curriculum are encouraged to share what they are reading]
- Learners will be given opportunities in lessons to read and explore complex vocabulary in order to develop a more academic style.

Reading and life chances

- Reading for pleasure is more important for children's cognitive development and life achievement than socio-economic background.
- 16-year-olds who choose to read books for pleasure outside of school are more likely to secure managerial or professional jobs in later life.
- Children who read books often at age 10 and more than once a week at age 16 gain higher results in maths, vocabulary and spelling tests at age 16 than those who read less regularly.
- Reading is proven to enhance relaxation, calmness, concentration, quality of life.
- Studies have found that reading for pleasure enhances empathy, understanding of the self, and the ability to understand one's own and others' identities.
- Regular readers for pleasure reported fewer feelings of stress and depression than non-readers, and stronger feelings of relaxation from reading than from watching television or engaging with technology intensive activities
- People who read for just 30 minutes a week are 20% more likely to report greater life satisfaction.

Computer Science Spotlight

As part of revision, we have switched up revision techniques in class by testing students' knowledge in another way, through group activity and competition. We ran a Bank Heist session, where students worked in teams of 4 to get inside a bank, empty out as many of the 90 safety deposit boxes by answering a computer science related question. If they got it correct, the team added money to their pot, if they got it wrong, the money disappeared! The teams had 30 minutes to empty as many boxes before they triggered a silent alarm, where they needed to use their exit strategy to get out of the bank. This was really putting their programming skills to test as teams needed to decode and unscramble a word which would release them out of the bank in time! This was a great activity our year 11s enjoyed and only three teams made it out! The winning team's final score was £29,110, although they couldn't take that in reality and split it four ways, the students were rewarded with a £20 Amazon voucher. Our winning team were: Grace Kelly, Lewis Longley, Emma Pini and Tabi Isaac.

Another session we ran, was testing the students' knowledge through a murder mystery. Students worked in teams of 2s and 3s to solve the murder within 45 minutes. Again, for students to progress through the different characters to interview and work out who the murderer was and the weapon used, students had to answer computer science related questions without the aid of their notes. From our 7 teams, only 4 teams solved the murder however, the team with the lowest points won the competition, our winning team, with zero points were: Luke Rice, Lucy Pitt and Ferne Harrison.
