ECOLOGY GARDEN OPENS



Charles Darwin School and its voluntary fund raising arm 'The Friends of Charles Darwin' officially opened its ecology garden on Wednesday 26 June, a project which has been 18 months in the design and creation.

The garden boasts trees, shrubs, wood piles, rockeries and a pond and is stocked with a range of garden plants and wild flowers over a 35m length; it is to be used as an area for the Science department to conduct ecological surveys and investigations, the school's Art department to use for observational studies and significantly the garden is also intended to be a place for quiet contemplation, study and counselling.

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The project has been funded by the 'Friends' group who work tirelessly on behalf of the school as well as donations from Cooling's Nurseries, local community groups and residents, the London Tree Scheme, Provender Nurseries and generous contributions from individuals who have supported the scheme with their labour and expertise.

The school would welcome any enquiries from local residents who would like to make a contribution to the garden or even lead a small volunteer group to help nurture the interest of young people in the skills of gardening.

Social Media Updates

Social media sites are regularly being updated and new Apps launched that target our Young People, making it very difficult for parents/ carers to keep up to date with. Schools often receive information updates regarding such sites and guidance on acceptable use so that we can share this information with our pupils and take steps to encourage them to be responsible with staying safe online. The most recent information received includes the following two sites/ Apps:

1. https://tellonym.me/ The App states that it 'Allows you to receive anonymous and honest feedback from everyone who is important to you'. It is only available on Apple devices at this time. It is aimed for older teens and with anonymity as the point of the app, the potential for cyberbullying is high.

Unfortunately anyone can find you on Tellonym not just your contacts, and information/ comments can be shared on Instagram. The App can be deactivated, or senders blocked so messages do not appear in the receivers inbox.

Parents should be vigilant with this form of social media as there is the potential to receive hurtful re marks without being able to identify who is making the comments.

2. Calculator+: after downloading the app, users simply tap in a numerical code and enter in the percentage symbol to unlock the app and access their hidden files. Calculator+ allows users to transfer photos and videos directly from their device's gallery into the vault app or take photos and videos directly within the app. This app provides the user to be secretive with the contents of their device and can break safeguarding regulations. Parents should be aware that this can be used to hide images and details of their child's life from them.

As a school we will continue to remind our students about staying safe online: blocking profiles and reporting unknown contacts to their parents/ carers, police/ CEOP (if necessary) and informing form tutors/Year team if impacting on school life. As mentioned previously, please can we encourage parents to keep lines of communication open with their children regarding what they are doing on line and their 'virtual' lives.
