Industrial Action

Parents will have seen from my letter earlier this week that after assessing the risk of the situation, I have made the decision to open the school on Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July only to Year 12 students. together with a small number of other students.

Year 12 students should be in the Sixth Form Hub for 8.50am. Students will attend lessons where teachers are in and for other lessons students will be supervised in the Hub while they work through the work set by their teachers on Satchel One. Home Study where lessons are not timetabled may be observed as usual.

School will be closed to students in Years 7, 8, 9 and 10. Teachers that are not taking strike action will be in school and will be leading live lessons via Teams or setting work via Satchel One. Please ask your child to access Satchel One at 8.30am to see the work for the day. All of the information for lessons will be provided on Satchel One as a first port of call. Staff who are hosting live lessons on Teams will publish instructions via Satchel One. To access a live lesson, students should open their Teams calendar and click to join the live lesson at the start. Students should have their camera off at all times and turn on their microphone when instructed to do so by teachers. Any work that needs to be submitted should be done by following teacher instructions during the lesson.

I am sorry that you will have to make alternative arrangements for your child at short notice and that they will experience disruption to their education. I understand that this situation may be frustrating and ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with mutual respect.

If your child receives a free school meal and would like to have one on Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July this can be collected from school between 11.30 and 13.00. However the catering providers will need to know in advance by emailing <u>charlesdarwin@harrisoncatering.co.uk</u> at least 24 hours before. Please include the name of the child/children in the e-mail.

Charles Darwin School remains committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our pupils and delivering high-quality teaching. We are working closely with our staff union representatives to keep up to date with the situation, and I will inform families as soon as possible if arrangements change further. At present, there is no further planned industrial action.

Inicio

I wrote to all families last week regarding the discussions between Charles Darwin Academy Trust (CDAT) and Inicio Educational Trust, to explore potentially merging into a single trust to grow and improve what we offer to our schools. Inicio Educational Trust will initially be made up of Bullers Wood School for Girls, Bullers Wood School for Boys and Chislehurst School for Girls and the notion is that the two schools within CDAT, Charles Darwin School and Biggin Hill Primary School, will merge to create a formidable educational institute of learning that will benefit all concerned without compromising the established identities of each school. Updated School Uniform from September 2023

You will have read in previous additions of the Link, and if you have been part of our new Year 7 Induction events, that the school uniform from September will be changing. This follows the whole school review of uniform in the Autumn term (staff, students and parents) which looked at reducing costs of certain key items of school uniform and PE kit and increasing choice of where some items could be bought by removing branding where appropriate.

You will know that the main changes are to have two price bands for skirts and blazers, and to update the House ties /blazer badges as the four Houses no longer exist across the school community as they did previously. There are other changes to the PE kit to remove branding/colour of some items in an effort to reduce cost and increase choice as to where items can be purchased. Girls can also choose to wear the school tie providing it is worn with a shirt collar from September 2023

The new uniform and kit is now available to purchase in advance of September via Oz Schoolwear, Petts Wood. Families should be advised to book an appointment time at the school shop asap as August slots go quickly and we are not the only school that Oz Schoolwear provide for. Families should not leave it until the end of the summer and assume there will still be items available.

Some of you may have already seen the new school ties and year badges to be worn by Years 7 - 10 in September 2023. There is now one school tie for these year groups based around the school colour of blue, and a blazer badge with a different band of colour for each year group (which year groups keep as they go up through the school, identifying the cohort ie year group, no longer the House).

For current students ie Years 7-9 now, ready for Years 8-10 in September, the new school ties and blazer badges can be ordered and paid for from the school via <u>Parent pay from Monday 19 June.</u>

There will also be assemblies from this date explaining these changes. We will then deliver badges/ties to individuals in the week following order/payment, with an aim to get all students ready this side of the summer holiday in advance of September 2023. The new Year 7's 2023 can continue to purchase their badges/ties from the school uniform shop or at Induction meetings in the school as they will not have a ParentPay account linked to their child until September.

The new tie and relevant colours of badges for year groups from September 2023 are as below:



Year 11's Sept 2023 will maintain the current House badges and ties, with any replacements at just £2. This is to minimise the need to change for just 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ terms before the end of the academic year and of course to reduce cost. The girls can also wear their house ties if they choose to.

Whilst this is a term time only role, the successful candidate will be expected to attend for four days in August for the examination results days.



ParentPay Canteen payments

Did you know you can set up an alert on ParentPay to notify you when your son/daughter's balance is running low? 


