#### **Covid Vaccinations for 12-15 year olds**

This week we received confirmation that Covid vaccines for students aged 12–15 will take place on Monday 7th March. This time around the vaccine programme is being administered by Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust who have confirmed that they will be offering 2nd jabs to eligible students, as well as 1st doses and booster doses to any student 12+ years who may require one. Further information together with the link to the electronic consent form will sent out in due course.

#### Safer Internet Day

The theme of Tuesday's Safer Internet Day was "All fun and games?" - exploring respect and relationships online. Key Stage 3 students were asked to complete a range of SID 2022 activities which helped them to reflect and discuss everyday online experiences which were relevant to many of them, most of which are experienced through online gaming. Year 7 students were then asked to pick a scenario from the activities and create a cartoon to show how the situation might evolve. It was good to see that some students are already following safe and respectful practices and the discussions were able to highlight where students initially incorrectly felt that their actions and comments were acceptable.

## Personal Development: Relationships Education through assemblies

During December and this half term, each year group in Year 7-11 has had an assembly delivered to them by a senior member of staff on Sexual Harassment and Sexual Abuse. The murders of Sarah Everard and Sabina Nessa alongside websites such as 'Everyone's Invited' and a subsequent Ofsted review in schools of sexual abuse has emphasised the role we all have to play in educating young people in their conduct towards each other. The Ofsted review identified that 37% of school girls reported experiencing sexual harassment in school compared to 6% of boys. We clearly all have a role to help young people to understand that any form of sexual discrimination, sexist language and sexual harassment cannot be tolerated.

An emphasis in the assemblies was around what harassment could look like in and around school and the importance of telling a trusted adult if this happens to you or you see it happening to others. The message was clear in that sexual harassment will not be tolerated at the school and we will continue to take a firm line on sanctioning this behaviour. Any reports would be taken seriously, children would be listened to and behaviour identified would not be tolerated. When appropriate, this may involve reporting incidents to the police or social care.

These assemblies are just a small part of our focus on developing a relevant, age appropriate Relationships and Sex Education across the school. I would encourage parents/carers to look at our policy on the school website and


