This week we have had a positive case of Covid-19 confirmed in our Year 11 bubble and as a consequence we have had to ask a significant number of Year 11 students to isolate. This is the third positive case identified in the school to date. It is also worth reminding all families at this point that:

If someone in the family is showing symptoms of the virus the guidance is that siblings or others in the family residing together should not attend school. This is a measure designed to reduce the spread of this virus. Please can all families be mindful of this.

In addition to the above this week we had a remote Ofsted visit and a Health and Safety Executive visit - all related to our management of the pandemic. These visits have been time consuming and on top of managing a complicated school picture have added to staff workloads. I am pleased to say that the outcomes of these visits were positive.

Remote learning instructions for individual students who are self-isolating

In the event that a student needs to isolate at short notice with symptoms of Coronavirus, whilst awaiting a test or having been told to do so by track and trace, teachers will aim to provide work for home learning as soon as they are able to do so. Sometimes however, this is not practical to do so straight away, such as the first day of isolation, as it is likely that they will be teaching the very classes that your child is absent from.

In the first instance, students should log onto the school website and identify the 'online learning platforms' icon on the home page or <u>https://</u>www.cdarwin.com/page/?title=Remote+LEarning&pid=403

This page of the website has a wide range of learning platforms that we use in school and for home study.

Students can access revision materials, videos, online assessments and subject material for each of their subjects that they can use to consolidate the learning that has taken place in the classroom, to revise and to deepen their subject knowledge whilst the class teacher is engaged in teaching classes in school. Students should also complete any work that has been posted on Show My Homework.

Whole School Detentions

Now that students have had time to settle back into school routines, Whole School Detention (WSD) will be returning from Monday 23 November.

To any new families, and especially to the new Year 7 parents/carers, the detention runs across 4 nights most weeks (not Tuesday). Detention length is 40 minutes and then escalating to 1 hour for missing a WSD without a valid reason or for poor behaviour in a detention. Senior Staff detentions are also held on these same evenings, lasting 1 hour 30 minutes. The entire teaching staff are involved in supervising WSD on rotation.

Any classroom teacher for Year 7-11 can issue a WSD, for low level disruption or for missing homework deadlines. Teachers will put a note in a student's planner at the time the detention is set. This serves as a reminder to the student and a notification to the parent/carer as to which teacher has set the detention and for what reason. Parents/carers will also receive a Call Parent text message the day before the detention so that they are reminded and/or are notified in advance.

If there is an issue with the date that the detention has been set, the Achievement Co-ordinator is the only person able to rearrange that detention. Any request for this must be done in advance as there is a set number allowed per session. Mr Wray in Student Services will manage this WSD system on a daily basis and will be following up with students to guery absence to a detention and to reset.

Shopping by Phone? Amazon App users:

Unfortunately as yet you cannot use Amazon Smile with the Amazon App on the iPhone/Android. However, the good news is that you can set up a shortcut to the Amazon Smile website which gives a near identical experience to the app. It's very quick and easy to do.

- 1. If you have the Amazon App installed you should remove it. To do this, tap and hold the app icon until it starts to jiggle. Tap the cross at the top left of the icon and confirm that you want to delete it. Don't worry, this will not delete your Amazon account or any of your settings.
- 2. Now open your internet browser and go to smile.amazon.co.uk
- 3. Tap the 'share' button 🛄 on the bottom of the screen.
- 4. Tap the 'Add to Home Screen' icon. You may need to swipe to the left to see this.
- Note: you can use the 'Add to Home Screen' option on android phones.
- 5. You will now have an Amazon Smile icon on your home screen which you can use in exactly the same way you used the Amazon App.
