Bromley Schools Athletics Championships

Boys and Girls from Year 7 and 8 represented the school over the past two weeks in the Bromley Minor Championships at a re-developing Norman Park Athletics Track, home of Blackheath and Bromley Harriers.

Preparation for the event coincided with the launch of The Darwin Games but left little opportunity for prolonged practice sessions to prepare our athletes for what is an elite event. Our selected athletes were therefore given target times to reach in their events given what staff knew about the likely performance levels our athletes were likely to encounter, this meant that performances were not just judged against the position which each athlete finished in but also the standards of expectation we set for them. The purpose of this is to ensure our athletes did not compare their performances just to the Club and County athletes on show but also to their own target standards; this meant we produced some brave and totally committed performances, generated a great deal of pleasure amongst our youngsters and left feeling positive with some perspective and experience under their belts.

One young man, **Harrison Dooler**, excelled and in his first performance in a major championship ever, he beat all-comers to the Shot Put title in Year 8; in the Year 7 Girls Shot Put, Freya Stalley replicated this feat and in the 100m Eva Falvey came a really creditable third; our 4x100m relay squad came just outside the podium places running in 5th overall; over the two days of competition there were several other notable performances with athletes getting to finals and finishing in the top 8 of 14 schools in their events. The most remarkable thing was how many athletes excelled against their target, thus creating a personal best that they can now aim to beat in future events; our youngsters have been referred to Blackheath and Bromley Harriers as a contact if they want to develop their athletic careers.

The Darwin Games is an idea put together by the PE department to create an opportunity for an inclusive athletics event for all students to become involved in during curriculum time. - The concepts of, and laws relating to, FGM, sexual consent, sexual exploitation, abuse, grooming, coercion, harassment, rape, domestic abuse, and how these can affect current and future relationships
- That all aspects of health can be affected by choices they make in sex and relationships, positively or negatively, for example physical, emotional, mental, sexual and reproductive health and wellbeing.


