E INBURGH'S AWARD

On Monday 13th January, a Celebration Assembly was held to congratulate and celebrate the success of both our Bronze and Silver Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) participants.

A Duke of Edinburgh award at Bronze or Silver level consists of sections covering volunteering, skills and physical activities as well as the expedition section. Our students have volunteered in school and at local charity shops, coached younger students and shared their skills, worked with the environment and animals, learnt to be self sufficient, how to plan and develop their teamwork skills, learnt first aid skills, carpentry skills, cooking skills, learnt new sports from martial arts to football and squash to dance and last but not least learnt to drive.



This is the first year I've really analysed the services that students have done and the contributions that students are clearly making to our local community and all the ways they are enriching themselves really confirms to me the value of a Duke of Edinburgh award and highlights the calibre of students that we have at our School.

We have 40 of 54 Bronze students pass their award and 14 of 15 Silver students also pass their awards which when compared to the 50% pass rate target for London Schools really emphasises the commitment of our students.
