Launch of GCSEPod

On Monday 10th February we will launch GCSEPod at Charles Darwin School. GCSEPod is an online resource which aims to provide students with an award winning mobile revision and study package. We have recently subscribed to GCSEPod for the benefit of our Year 11 and 10 pupils. Other pupils will eventually have access to this – probably commencing September 2020.

We are told that GCSEPod is a particularly successful revision and study package; pupils who make regular and extensive use of GCSEPod typically achieve 1 grade higher or more in their GCSE subjects.

This online resource uses podcasts to revise and reinforce key concepts and skills that are essential for GCSE success across all subjects in the curriculum, the pod casts cover all levels and are thus suitable for students of all abilities.

How does it work?

Pupils have unlimited access to 12,000+ hours of curriculum relevant GCSE learning and revision material delivered in the unique 'Pod' format. Each podcast delivers a concentrated burst of knowledge lasting between 3 to 5 minutes. They are audio and visual in format meaning that they are accessible to all pupils and are clear for all pupils to understand. Students are able to download this content to their mobile phones and/ or pcs at home and listen to the pods where and when they wish. The podcasts do not take up huge amounts of memory and being mobile, pupils can plug in their personal headphones and revise on the way to and from school, as they ride on the bus, at home at any time and even on holiday. Basically, it's available to them 24/7. The podcasts have all been mapped to the specific exam specifications for each subject taught at Charles Darwin School.

Once launched on Monday to Year 11 and then later on to Year 10 we are hoping that all students will make regular and extensive use of this valuable resource. I would be grateful if parents could encourage their children in Years 11 and 10 to please make full use of this really innovative way to revise and ensure even better progress.


