#### **Coronavirus Update**

This week our pupils were all informed in their tutor groups about the precautions we can all take to minimise the risks associated with the spreading of the Coronavirus. Form Tutors have gone through messages about hand washing, maintaining social distance, respiratory hygiene, the need to avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth and what to do if a student feels unwell with fever, breathing difficulty and a cough.

In addition, various parts of the school have had appropriate signage put on display and hand sanitizer made available to ensure improved awareness and improved hygiene. Parents will appreciate that it is important to inform pupils to help protect them whilst at the same time keeping a good sense of proportion; not engendering a panicky response.

I have to say that the response from the vast majority of our school community has been superb; mature and sensible in the face of the potential challenges and anxieties following the constant news reports about the spread of this virus. My thanks to all pupils, staff and parents for their good sense and support.

This week we also received more detailed guidance from the Department of Education in relation to managing any suspected virus related incidents. The guidance is detailed and outlines a consistent approach to school closure amongst other things. It says that no school should close in response to a suspected (or confirmed) COVID-19 case unless directed to do so by Public Health England. We have used parts of this new guidance to produce a school protocol should we need to manage a suspected case.

Parents and carers will be aware that there are a number of decisions about school trips and visits that are likely to be influenced by this Coronavirus outbreak. At the moment we have decided that we will only cancel school trips and visits if it is absolutely necessary and only after taking appropriate advice. Depending on how things progress nationally and internationally over the next few weeks we may need to change this stance and it may affect trips where the wellbeing of our pupils and staff is likely to be compromised.

Dear Parents & Carers

I am writing to let you know that the school has been informed of an online safeguarding concern involving a new live-streaming app recently released.

I would ask you to be alert for signs of your child downloading the UNICO LIVE app from social media sites. This app has been found to have high levels of engagement from adults instructing children to engage in sexualised activity.

This app is potentially very dangerous. The advice from the Safer Schools Team is that parents should check that your child hasn't down loaded this app, and if they have, help them remove it.

Please remain vigilant and check what apps your daughter/son has downloaded. Please continue to remind them to only engage with other people that they know on line.
