The Year 9 Geography students have been walking to the woodland at Downe Activity Centre to investigate ecosystems, which is the first unit of the GCSE course.

We investigated what species of plants, insects and animals there were in a typical British deciduous forest ecosystem and then used that to create food webs. We did some field sketching and identified biotic and abiotic features of an ecosystem as well as considering how the nutrient cycle works in this type of ecosystem. It was a good time of year to see some interesting fungi and on one trip we were lucky to see a deer.

The students are now looking out for local birds of prey - sparrowhawks, red kites and buzzards as we didn't see any while we were there.
