Open Day/Open Week

Student Behaviour

It was pleasing to receive yet another email this week from a member of the public commending the behaviour of our students on the bus. We do receive a number of such emails and I have reproduced below some of the comments he made:

"As the bus drove through Biggin Hill, it picked up more passengers at the several stops, including school children, at around 3:30 pm. Soon, there were two dozen or so school children boarding the bus. In terms of behaviour, I was expecting the worse - my local bus service is a nightmare due to feral children. Then, I gradually became aware of something quite unexpected: these children were all incredibly well behaved. In particular, I observed these things about them.

- First, very few of them were holding or using mobile phones; they actually conversed face-to-face with each other!
- Secondly, they were softly spoken and courteous to each other, in both words and facial expression.

Indeed, their whole demeanour showed empathy, genuine respect and kindness. And when the time came for them to alight at New Addington Tram Station, they did so in an orderly fashion, with no pushing or shoving. It was so lovely and refreshing to witness this behaviour.

I wish more children - and adults - were like this."

50th Anniversary Courtyard Renovation

Students and staff have been involved throughout the process, starting with a competition to design a mural for the wall. The design brief was to create a mural design for the large wall that celebrated the work of Charles Darwin and had a tropical botanical garden vibe.

Students from several year groups entered the competition and the winning design was created by Leo Currier in 8HBu, who, as usual with all of his homework, put lots of thought and effort into producing a creative and thoughtful design. On the 2 enrichment days at the end of term, we started phase 2 of the project, which was the creation and painting of wooden planters to go in the corners of the courtyard. It has been lovely to be able to complete this project commemorating 50 years of Charles Darwin School by involving so many different members of our community- students, teachers, support staff, parents and former pupils. They then performed the opening of the play before returning to the presentation and summing up what happened to Breck. The final part of their workshop involved an collaborative activity, with the year 10's and 11's working with small groups of year 6's to come up with an online superhero.

Following on from this, the students shared the opening of Game Over to year 7 in an assembly this week. They did a great job and rose to the challenge of performing in front of an audience of 200 students and staff.

The project ended on Wednesday with a performance to parents and friends. This time, students were able to share the piece in full and communicate the tragic consequences of what happened to Breck and the impact on his family.

The cast have worked fantastically, sustaining their efforts and energy in rehearsal since the summer term. They have been great Healthy Relationship Ambassadors, spreading the important message about online safety and what grooming looks like, in an accessible and engaging way.


