#### Remembrance

#### **SHARP Project**

My thanks to Mrs. Rees for overseeing the SHARP project day on Tuesday. It was a hard hitting and immersive day enabling the students to see into an operating theatre as staff treated a victim of a stabbing, talk to ambulance drivers and learn first aid protocols. Students also learnt of the devastating impact knife crime has on families and the community and were given the opportunity to speak to ambassadors who had themselves been a victim of knife crime. Students were also given contact details of individuals they could speak to should they have concerns about knife crime. I was very impressed by the maturity shown by the students on this extremely important and emotive topic.

#### PD Drop Morning

Thursday's Personal Development drop morning went very well indeed with every year group taking part. Along with other members of the SLT and Achievement Coordinators, I dropped into some of the classes and it was great to see the students so focused on their particular topics. The atmosphere was really positive and productive with high levels of student engagement.

Year 7 and 8 students worked on Growth Mindset with Year 7 participating in activities called Synapse Strengthener ..., learning a new skill and learning from mistakes. Year 8 took part in a communication workshop to develop skills in managing how we speak and communicate with each other and the Year 9 and 10 session was a 'consequences of drugs' workshop which not just outlined the dangers of drugs in the short term, but the impact on the social aspects and wellbeing of young people.

Students in Year 11 worked on PiXL revision skills whilst Year 12 and 13 students spent time on a revision programme for their upcoming PPEs or UCAS applications.

#### Year 10 BIMA Day

On Wednesday, 60 students from Computer Science and Business Studies came together to take part in the annual BIMA Digital Day which gives 11-16 year olds an insight into a world of digital careers. The students worked with an external agency, met digital experts and competed in a sponsored, nationwide digital challenge on behalf of their virtual client for the day, Vue Cinemas. Their work has then been entered into a National Competition for a chance to win £500 cash for the school and some fantastic prizes for themselves. Fingers crossed!!

- Understanding what additional information you might need to support your young people to have healthy relationships



Well done James. We are really proud of you!






# **Black History Month - October 2023**

Over the past month students and staff have been celebrating and developing our knowledge and understanding of Black History. There has been a wide range of activities and learning experiences to mark this important event. Year groups have had assemblies dedicated to this theme led by staff and students.

Y8 for example had an assembly led by **Owen Asemota** from 8SHO. Owen also produced the BHM display in the library that featured in The Link a few weeks ago. The display included information on the BHM theme for this year of Saluting Our Sisters. The theme Saluting our Sisters pays homage to black women who had contributions ignored, ideas appropriated, and voices silenced. His contributions didn't end there either; Owen also organise a cake sale in support of BHM! To recognise these efforts, we have re published the picture of Owen from last time.

Elsewhere students have been learning a great deal about the contributions of people of African -Caribbean descent both in the UK and beyond. In Art lessons students looked at **Althea McNish**, a textile designer who was amongst the first, if not the first, designer of African-Caribbean descent to achieve international recognition. Her designs injected much-needed colour and life into the post-war fashion and textiles industry from the 1950s onwards. Students created oil pastel mono prints of her





English covered a range of different areas. For KS3 students looked at a range of poems from **John Agard's** 'Checking out me history' to 'Strange Fruit' by **Abel Merropol.** 

Y10 looked at an extract from 'Thank you Ma'am by **James Mercer Langston Hughes**. Year 11 debated whether 'Black History Month' needed to be integrated into school curriculums more fully instead of celebrated in a stand-alone month.

In Maths students explored the female NASA mathematicians **Katherine Johnson, Dorothy Vaughan, and Mary Jackson** that were shown in the film Hidden Figures. The same theme was picked up and discussed further in Science. Katherine Johnson was nicknamed the "human computer" for her incredible mathematical skills. She was one of the first African American women to work for

NASA and contributed to the Apollo 11 mission to the moon and back. **Bessie Coleman** is another black woman whose story was delved into. She was an American pilot (the first female Native American pilot) and carried out daring acrobatic manoeuvres that earnt her the name "Brave Bessie". Both of these women have inspired future generations.

During PE students have been celebrating many great black sporting heroes Students have competed during their PE lesson and extra-curricular clubs in teams named after a BHM hero. Within these lessons, they have discussed their background, achievements and impact on society. Students have also gained bonus Achievement Points for those who knew the most about their teams sporting hero. These included amongst

others: Tiger Woods, Serena Williams, Jesse Owe, Alex Scott and Dina Asher-Smith.

The Music department gave students the opportunity to identify and listen to the work of black composers via a BHM calendar and linked Spotify for students to playlist. This provided a great opportunity to explore the work of inspiring figures from **Quincy Jones** to **Ella Fitzgerald** and right up to more recent composers and artists such as **Lauren Hill** and **Stormzy**.

Finally, the History department organised a poster competition for the best designed poster explaining the significance of BHM. Some examples are shown here. Well done to all those who entered.

The above are just a few highlights of the types of learning experiences that our school community had been involved in with regard to BHM. This important theme fits very well of course with our own school ethos of mutual respect.




Strong Woman: The Truth About Getting To The Top - Karren Brady
