Remember, if you know sizes, Oz Schoolwear will take online and phone orders which can be delivered straight to the school for collection Thursday from lunchtime. This helps many families who don't live as local to Petts Wood where they are based. You or your son/ daughter can collect purchased items from main reception after delivery, normally late morning.

A reminder of our school uniform policy as we come to the end of the spring term and the weather changes:

- Blazers remain a compulsory item of school uniform Year 7-11 and should be in school every day
- V neck blue school jumpers remain an optional additional item and can be worn with the blazer
- Hoodies should not be worn in school and will be confiscated if they are seen
- Shoes should be worn in school, not trainers unless a medical note has been signed by the Achievement co-ordinator in the planner
- Jewellery should not be worn in school. This includes earrings. If seen, these items will be confiscated.
- Make-up [should be discreet including lashes].
- No bandanas, hoods, caps and hats.

Students can and do ask teachers to remove blazers if classrooms are warm. When the weather is consistently hotter, the Headteacher will notify the school community when blazers can be left in lockers for the day.

We will continue to remind students of our uniform expectations via tutors, teachers and in assemblies. Please can families ensure any missing items of uniform are replaced asap and at the latest before the return in the summer term. Remember we have a very well stocked PreLoved uniform shop which has good quality barely used uniform based in school which all our families can use. Contact details are via the school website or Student Services. Blazer badges and ties can be collected from main reception, having been paid for via ParentPay.

Finally as we expect to see the weather change, please remind your son/daughter that water should be brought into school in a refillable bottle. Students can refill water bottles at fountains in their breaks and lunchtimes but will not be permitted to leave classrooms to do so unless in an emergency.

A questionnaire went out to parents about setting up a Parent Forum – please see a summary of the questionnaire.

Summary of Parent Forum

- 1. 70% of parents who answered questionnaire agreed or strongly agreed that participating in parent forum will benefit them as a parent.
- 2. 93% of parents who answered questionnaire have not been involved with PTA.
- 3. Majority of parents want to or may participate in parent forum 29% yes 39% maybe
- 4. 61% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that the goals and objectives of the parent forum are clear.
- 5. 47% of parents would rather the meeting happen online where as 32% would prefer the meetings to be after school. There were very few parents who wanted the meetings during the school day.
- 6. 81% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that the Parent Forum could be a valuable initiative for parents to help shape the future direction of the school.

The first meeting of The Parent Forum will be on **Thursday 1st May at 4.30pm**. We will meet in **Main Reception**.

The topic for discussion will be the following - this is based on the feedback provided from parents.

- 1. Homework This will include items such as: frequency, challenge, types of H/W
- 2. Communication The Link, communications policy, website, satchel one, reports.


