Adverse Weather Arrangements

We are now approaching the season where we may expect more extreme winter weather. With this in mind I would like to remind parents of our procedures in case of adverse weather.

Whilst recognising that it is our duty to remain open if at all possible, the health and safety of staff and students battling through adverse weather conditions must be weighed against the health and safety of students who, for whatever reason, expect to be in our care during school time. A decision to close the school in adverse conditions is thus seen as a last resort and is only made if there are concerns regarding the welfare and safety of staff and students. The weather conditions in Biggin Hill can often be very different to those in the more built-up areas and the number of hills and narrow roads in the vicinity compounds the problem.

Summary of key information regarding school closure:

- The decision to open or close the school will be made by the Headteacher.
- The decision will be made by 7.30am.
- Should the school need to be closed due to extreme weather a message will be posted on the school website and our Twitter and Instagram pages. All are updated regularly.
- You are advised to check the school website prior to sending your son/daughter to school.
- The school will liaise with the bus companies but are not responsible for the bus services and advise
 parents to check with TfL to find out which services are running, cancelled or terminating at a different
 stop.
- In the event of school closure home learning will be expected and work set for students on Satchel One

If the weather deteriorates **during the school day** students may be allowed to go home early and parents will be alerted by text message via Call Parent. In this regard please can parents ensure that the school has up-to-date contact details.

The decision whether to send pupils into school or to collect those already at school rests with parents themselves.

When exceptional weather is expected the following guidelines should be noted:

Clothina:

Students should wear appropriate clothing, taking into account the type of weather. Suitable footwear to cope with weather may be necessary, but school shoes should be brought and changed into upon entry to the school building.

Transportation:

Parents are advised to check local transportation information if their son/daughter travels by public transport or via the school mini bus. There is a specific policy for the school minibus service of which parents and the students concerned are aware. The bus companies do keep us informed of the transport situation and students will be alerted to any transport difficulties as we become aware of them. If, due to the weather, your son/daughter cannot get to school, parents should telephone the school in the usual way to report this absence.


Reading Corner at Charles Darwin


