GCSE POD

Students in year 10 and 11 have had their usernames and passwords changed so that they are the same as logging in to SatchelOne and Tassomai. This makes the 'single sign on' process easier.

GCSE POD is a programme that we subscribe to that enables students to work independently outside of the lesson time on exam-board specific learning in preparation for their final exams. The PODS are bitesize instructional videos that students can watch. From this, teachers can set 'assignments' or 'check and challenge' learning pathways to enable independent revision. Students can also work independently on topics that they need to. Feedback goes to students and teachers, including identifying any gaps in knowledge.

There are instructional videos and guidance for parents on the website, in addition to how to download the app for android or iPhone. GCSE POD provide plenty of evidence and research that shows regular use improves GCSE grades. Each month, there will be a prize draw for the highest users in each year group which will be Amazon vouchers.



Ballet Shoes by Noel Streatfeild



Ballet Shoes is a fictional children's book about three sisters by adoption who each have their own special talent. Pauline, the eldest, is rescued from a sinking ship by Great Uncle Matthew who gives her to Sylvia, the girls' guardian as a gift. Pauline is a very talented actress. Petrova, the next Fossil child, is adopted because her father is dying in hospital and her mother is no longer around. Petrova has no wish to perform on stage like her sisters, but instead is passionate about mechanics and cars. Posy, the youngest, has no father and her mother has no time for babies so she too becomes a Fossil sister. Posy's mother is a dancer and gives her the gift of beautiful ballet shoes. Posy is a perfect ballerina.

Great Uncle Matthew goes on a voyage and doesn't return for years and years. Instead, he leaves Sylvia money to look after and care for Pauline, Petrova and Posy. But when money begins to run out, the three Fossil sisters are determined to earn their keep on stage...




