#### INTERPRETATION

- 1 In these Articles
  - a "the Academies" means all the schools and educational institutions referred to in Articles 4a) and established by the Company (and "Academy" shall mean any one of those schools or educational institutions),
  - b "Academy Financial Year" means the academic year from 1<sup>st</sup> of September to 31<sup>st</sup> of August of the following year,
  - "Academy Director" means a Director appointed pursuant to Articles
    51 and 52,
  - "Advisory Body" means a committee appointed by the Directors pursuant to Articles 100-104 of representatives of one or more of the Academies to advise the Directors on the functioning of the Academies which may be established as or in addition to a Local Governing Body,
  - e "the Articles" means these Articles of Association of the Company,
  - f "Chief Inspector" means Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education, Children's Services and Skills or his successor,

- g "clear days" in relation to the period of a notice means the period excluding the day when the notice is given or deemed to be given and the day on which it is given or on which it is to take effect,
- h "Clerk" means the clerk to the Directors or any other person appointed to perform the duties of the clerk to the Directors, including a joint, assistant or deputy clerk,
- "the Company" means save as otherwise defined at Article 6 9 the company intended to be regulated by these Articles and referred to in Article 2,
- "the Directors" means save as otherwise defined at Article 6 9 the directors of the Company (and "Director" means any one of those directors),
- k "financial expert" means an individual, company or firm who is authorised to give investment advice under the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000,
- I "the LAs" means all the local authorities covering the areas in which the Academies are situated (and "the LA" shall mean any one of these local authorities),
- m "Local Authority Associated Persons" means any person associated with any local authority within the meaning given in section 69 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989,
- n "Local Governing Bodies" means the committees appointed pursuant to Articles 100-101 and 104 (and "Local Governing Body" means any one of these committees),
- o "Member" means a member of the Company and someone who as such is bound by the undertaking contained in Article 8,

- p "the Memorandum" means the Memorandum of Association of the Company,
- q "Office" means the registered office of the Company,
- r "Parent Directors" means the Directors if elected or appointed pursuant to Articles 53 56 inclusive,
- s "Principals" means the head teachers or heads of school of the Academies (and "Principal" means any one of these head teachers or heads of schools),
- t "Principal Regulator" means the body or person appointed as the Principal Regulator under the Charities Act 2011,
- u "Relevant Funding Agreements" means the agreement or agreements entered into by the Company and the Secretary of State under section 1 of the Academies Act 2010 for the establishment of each Academy, including any variation or supplemental agreements thereof,
- v "Scheme of Delegation" means the formal terms of reference for the delegation of powers and responsibilities by the Directors to the Local Governing Bodies,
- w "the seal" means the common seal of the Company if it has one,
- x "Secretary of State" means the Secretary of State for Education or successor,
- "Sponsor" means such body or organisation recognised by the Secretary of State as the sponsor, supporter or promoter of the Supported Academy which for the avoidance of doubt may include one of the Academies established and maintained by the Company [and where there are multiple Supported Academies with different Sponsors then the relevant Sponsor for the Supported Academy,

- z "Supported Academy" means an Academy who is either sponsored or supported by the Sponsor from time to time and whilst it is so sponsored or supported as determined by the Directors,
- as "Staff Director" means an employee of the Company who may be appointed as a Director pursuant to Article 50A<sup>1</sup>,
- bb "teacher" means a person employed under a contract of employment or a contract for services or otherwise engaged to provide his services as a teacher at one or more Academies,
- cc "the United Kingdom" means Great Britain and Northern Ireland,
- dd words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender. Words importing the singular number shall include the plural number, and vice versa,
- ee subject as aforesaid, words or expressions contained in these Articles shall, unless the context requires otherwise, bear the same meaning as in the Companies Act 2006, as appropriate,
- ff any reference to a statute or statutory provision shall include any statute or statutory provision which replaces or supersedes such statute or statutory provision including any modification or amendment thereto
- 2 The Company's name is Charles Darwin Academy Trust (and in this document it is called "the Company")
- 3 The Company's registered office is to be situated in England and Wales

## **OBJECT**

4 The Company's object ("the Object") is specifically restricted to the following

Its unlikely that there will be elected staff members on the Strategic Board of Directors in view of the size of body this would result in, but the flexibility to appoint an executive team e.g. finance director and CEO may be useful

- (a) to advance for the public benefit education in the United Kingdom, in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing by establishing, maintaining, carrying on, managing and developing schools ("the mainstream Academies") offering a broad and balanced curriculum or educational institutions which are principally concerned with providing full-time or parttime education for children of compulsory school age who, by reason of illness, exclusion from school or otherwise, may not for any period receive suitable education unless alternative provision is made for them ("the alternative provision Academies") or 16 to 19 Academies offering a curriculum appropriate to the needs of its students ("the 16 to 19 Academies") or specially organised to make schools educational provision for pupils with Special Educational Needs ("the Special Academies")
- b) to promote for the benefit of the inhabitants of the areas served by the Academies the provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving the condition of life of the said inhabitants <sup>2</sup>
- In furtherance of the Object but not further or otherwise the Company may exercise the following powers -

- (a) to draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills, cheques and other instruments, and to operate bank accounts in the name of the Company,
- (b) to raise funds and to invite and receive contributions provided that in raising funds the Company shall not undertake any substantial permanent trading activities and shall conform to any relevant statutory regulations,
- (c) to acquire, alter, improve and (subject to such consents as may be required by law) to charge or otherwise dispose of property,
- (d) subject to Article 6 below to employ such staff, as are necessary for the proper pursuit of the Object and to make all reasonable and necessary provision for the payments of pensions and superannuation to staff and their dependants,
- (e) to establish or support, whether financially or otherwise, any charitable companies, trusts, associations or institutions formed for all or any of the Object,
- (f) to co-operate with other charities, other independent and maintained schools, schools maintained by a local authority, 16-19 Academies, alternative provision Academies, institutions within the further education sector, voluntary bodies and statutory authorities operating in furtherance of the Object and to exchange information and advice with them,
- (g) to pay out of funds of the Company the costs, charges and expenses of and incidental to the formation and registration of the Company,
- (h) to establish, maintain, carry on, manage and develop the Academies at locations to be determined by the Directors and in so doing shall have regard to the respective ethos and mission statement of each academy,

- to offer scholarships, exhibitions, prizes and awards to pupils and students former pupils and former students, and otherwise to encourage and assist pupils and students and former pupils and former students,
- (j) to provide educational facilities and services to students of all ages and the wider community for the public benefit,
- (k) to carry out research into the development and application of new techniques in education and to their approach to curriculum development and delivery and to publish the results of such research, and to develop means of benefiting from application of the experience of industry, commerce, other schools, educational institutions and the voluntary sector to the education of pupils and students in academies.
- (I) subject to such consents as may be required by law and/or by any contract entered into by or on behalf of the Company, to borrow and raise money for the furtherance of the Object in such manner and on such security as the Company may think fit,
- (m) to deposit or invest any funds of the Company not immediately required for the furtherance of its object (but to invest only after obtaining such advice from a financial expert as the Directors consider necessary and having regard to the suitability of investments and the need for diversification),
- (n) to delegate the management of investments to a financial expert, but only on terms that
  - (i) the investment policy is set down in writing for the financial expert by the Directors,
  - (ii) every transaction is reported promptly to the Directors,
  - (III) the performance of the investments is reviewed regularly with the Directors,

- (iv) the Directors are entitled to cancel the delegation arrangement at any time,
- (v) the investment policy and the delegation arrangement are reviewed at least once a year,
- (vi) all payments due to the financial expert are on a scale or at a level which is agreed in advance and are notified promptly to the Directors on receipt, and
- (vii) the financial expert must not do anything outside the powers of the Directors,
- (o) to arrange for investments or other property of the Company to be held in the name of a nominee company acting under the control of the Directors or of a financial expert acting under their instructions, and to pay any reasonable fee required,
- (p) to provide indemnity insurance to Directors and members of any Local Governing Body (in so far as necessary) in accordance with, and subject to the conditions of section 232 to 235 of the Companies Act 2006, section 189 of the Charities Act 2011 or any other provision of law applicable to charitable companies and any such indemnity is limited accordingly,
- (q) to establish subsidiary companies to carry on any trade or business for the purpose of raising funds for the Company,
- (r) to do all such other lawful things as are necessary for or are incidental to or conducive to the achievement of the Objects
- 6.1 The income and property of the Company shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the Object
- 6.2 None of the income or property of the Company may be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend bonus or otherwise by way of profit to any member of the Company Nonetheless a member of the

## Company who is not also a Director may

- a) benefit as a beneficiary of the Company,
- b) be paid reasonable and proper remuneration for any goods or services supplied to the Company,
- c) be paid rent for premises let by the member of the Company if the amount of the rent and other terms of the letting are reasonable and proper, and
- d) be paid interest on money lent to the Company at a reasonable and proper rate, such rate not to exceed 2 per cent per annum below the base lending rate of a UK clearing bank selected by the Directors, or 0.5%, whichever is the higher
- 6.3 A Director and a member of any Local Governing Body (in so far as necessary) may benefit from any indemnity insurance purchased at the Company's expense to cover the liability of the Directors and members of the Local Governing Body which by virtue of any rule of law would otherwise attach to them in respect of any negligence, default or breach of trust or breach of duty of which they may be guilty in relation to the Company Provided that any such insurance shall not extend to (i) any claim arising from any act or omission which Directors or the Local Governing Body knew to be a breach of trust or breach of duty or which was committed by the Directors or members of the Local Governing Body in reckless disregard to whether it was a breach of trust or breach of duty or not, and (ii) the costs of any unsuccessful defence to a criminal prosecution brought against the Directors or the Local Governing Body in their capacity as directors or trustees of the Company Further, this Article does not authorise a Director or member of a Local Governing Body to benefit from any indemnity insurance that would be rendered void by any provision of the Companies Act 2006, the Charities Act 2011 or any other provision of law
- 6 4 A company, which has shares listed on a recognised stock exchange

and of which any one Director holds no more than 1% of the issued capital of that company, may receive fees, remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth from the Company

A Director may at the discretion of the Directors be reimbursed from the property of the Company for reasonable expenses properly incurred by him or her when acting on behalf of the Company, but excluding expenses in connection with foreign travel

## 66 No Director may

- (a) buy any goods or services from the Company,
- (b) sell goods, services, or any interest in land to the Company,
- (c) be employed by, or receive any remuneration from the Company (other than the Principalsor any Staff Director whose employment and/or remuneration is subject to the procedure and conditions in Article 6.8),
- (d) receive any other financial benefit from the Company, unless
  - (i) the payment is permitted by Article 6.7 and the Directors follow the procedure and observe the conditions set out in Article 6.8, or
  - (ii) the Directors obtain the prior written approval of the Charity Commission and fully comply with any procedures it prescribes

## 6 7 Subject to Article 6 8, a Director may

- a) receive a benefit from the Company in the capacity of a beneficiary of the Company
- b) be employed by the Company or enter into a contract for the supply of goods or services to the Company, other than for acting as a Director
- c) receive interest on money lent to the Company at a reasonable and proper rate not exceeding 2% per annum below the base rate of a

- clearing bank to be selected by the Directors, or 0 5%, whichever is the higher
- d) receive rent for premises let by the Director to the Company if the amount of the rent and the other terms of the lease are reasonable and proper
- 6 8 The Company and its Directors may only rely upon the authority provided by Article 6 7 if each of the following conditions is satisfied
  - (a) the remuneration or other sums paid to the Director do not exceed an amount that is reasonable in all the circumstances
  - (b) the Director is absent from the part of any meeting at which there is discussion of
    - his or her employment, remuneration, or any matter concerning the contract, payment or benefit, or
    - ii) his or her performance in the employment, or his or her performance of the contract (unless present solely in his or her capacity as an employee), or
    - iii) any proposal to enter into any other contract or arrangement with him or her or to confer any benefit upon him or her that would be permitted under Article 6.7, or
    - (iv) any other matter relating to a payment or the conferring of any benefit permitted by Article 6 7
  - (c) the Director does not vote on any such matter and is not to be counted when calculating whether a quorum of Directors is present at the meeting
  - (d) save in relation to employing or contracting with the Principalsor any Staff Director the other Directors are satisfied that it is in the interests of the Company to employ or to contract with that Director rather than with someone who is not a Director. In reaching that decision the

Directors must balance the advantage of employing a Director against the disadvantages of doing so (especially the loss of the Director's services as a result of dealing with the Director's conflict of interest)

- (e) the reason for their decision is recorded by the Directors in the minute book
- (f) a majority of the Directors then in office have received no such payments or benefit

6 8A The provision in Article 6 6 (c) that no Director may be employed by or receive any remuneration from the Company (other than a Staff Director and the Principal) does not apply to an employee of the Company who is subsequently elected or appointed as a Director save that this Article shall only allow such a Director to receive remuneration or benefit from the Company in his capacity as an employee of the Company and provided that the procedure as set out in Articles 6 8(b)(i), (ii) and 6 8 (c) is followed

### 69 In Articles 6 2-6 9

- (a) "company" shall include any company in which the Company
  - holds more than 50% of the shares, or

- 8 Every member of the Company undertakes to contribute such amount as may be required (not exceeding £10) to the Company's assets if it should be wound up while he or she is a member or within one year after he or she ceases to be a member, for payment of the Company's debts and liabilities before he or she ceases to be a member, and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up, and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories among themselves
- If the Company is wound up or dissolved and after all its debts and liabilities (including any under section 2 of the Academies Act 2010) have been satisfied there remains any property it shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Company (except to a member that is itself a charity), but shall be given or transferred to some other charity or charities having objects similar to the Object which prohibits the distribution of its or their income and property to an extent at least as great as is imposed on the Company by Article 6 above, chosen by the members of the Company at or before the time of dissolution and if that cannot be done then to some other charitable object

### PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

- No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum is present. A Member counts towards the quorum by being present either in person or by proxy. Two persons entitled to vote upon the business to be transacted, each being a Member or a proxy of a Member or a duly authorised representative of a Member organisation shall constitute a quorum.
- 24 If a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting, or if during a meeting a quorum ceases to be present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place or to such time and place as the Directors may determine
- The chairman, if any, of the Directors or in his absence some other Director nominated by the Directors shall preside as chairman of the meeting, but if neither the chairman nor such other Director (if any) be present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting and willing to act, the Directors present shall elect one of their number to be chairman and, if there is only one Director present and willing to act, he shall be the chairman

no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the

adjournment not taken place When a meeting is adjourned for fourteen days

or more, at least seven clear days' notice shall be given specifying the time

and place of the adjourned meeting and the general nature of the business to

be transacted Otherwise it shall not be necessary to give any such notice

hands unless before, or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands,

a poll is duly demanded Subject to the provisions of the Companies Act

2006, a poll may be demanded -

(a) by the chairman, or

(b) by at least two Members having the right to vote at the meeting, or,

(c) by a Member or Members representing not less than one-tenth of

the total voting rights of all the Members having the right to vote at

the meeting

30 Unless a poll is duly demanded a declaration by the chairman that a

resolution has been carried or carried unanimously, or by a particular majority,

or lost, or not carried by a particular majority and an entry to that effect in the

minutes of the meeting shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof

of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such

resolution

31 The demand for a poll may be withdrawn, before the poll is taken, but

only with the consent of the chairman. The withdrawal of a demand for a poll shall not invalidate the result of a show of hands declared before the demand for the poll was made.

- 32 A poll shall be taken as the chairman directs and he may appoint scrutineers (who need not be Members) and fix a time, date and place for declaring the results. The result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded
- 33 A poll demanded on the election of the chairman or on a question of adjournment shall be taken immediately. A poll demanded on any other question shall be taken either immediately or at such time, date and place as the chairman directs not being more than thirty days after the poll is demanded. The demand for a poll shall not prevent continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other than the question on which the poll is demanded. If a poll is demanded before the declaration of the result of a show of hands and the demand is duly withdrawn, the meeting shall continue as if the demand had not been made.
- No notice need be given of a poll not taken immediately if the time and place at which it is to be taken are announced at the meeting at which it is demanded. In other cases at least seven clear days' notice shall be given specifying the time and place at which the poll is to be taken.

  - a any vacancy among their number, or
  - b any defect in the election, appointment or nomination of any Director
- 123 A resolution in writing, signed by all the Directors entitled to receive notice of a meeting of Directors or of a committee of Directors, shall be valid and effective as if it had been passed at a meeting of Directors or (as the case may be) a committee of Directors duly convened and held. Such a resolution may consist of several documents in the same form, each signed by one or more of the Directors.
- 124. Subject to Article 125, the Directors shall ensure that a copy of
  - a the agenda for every meeting of the Directors,
  - b the draft minutes of every such meeting, if they have been approved by the person acting as chairman of that meeting,

- c the signed minutes of every such meeting, and
- d any report, document or other paper considered at any such meeting,

are, as soon as is reasonably practicable, made available at every Academy to persons wishing to inspect them

- 125 There may be excluded from any item required to be made available in pursuance of Article 124, any material relating to
  - a a named teacher or other person employed, or proposed to be employed, at any Academy,
- b a named pupil or named student at, or candidate for admission to, any Academy, and
  - c any matter which, by reason of its nature, the Directors are satisfied should remain confidential
- 126 Any Director shall be able to participate in meetings of the Directors by telephone or video conference provided that
  - a he has given notice of his intention to do so detailing the telephone number on which he can be reached and/or appropriate details of the video conference suite from which he shall be taking part at the time of the meeting at least 48 hours before the meeting, and,
  - the Directors have access to the appropriate equipment if after all reasonable efforts it does not prove possible for the person to participate by telephone or video conference the meeting may still proceed with its business provided it is otherwise quorate

#### PATRONS AND HONORARY OFFICERS

127 The Directors may from time to time appoint any person whether or not a Member of the Company to be a patron of the Company or to hold any

honorary office and may determine for what period he is to hold such office

THE SEAL

The seal, if any, shall only be used by the authority of the Directors or

of a committee of Directors authorised by the Directors. The Directors may

determine who shall sign any instrument to which the seal is affixed and

#### **NOTICES**

Any notice to be given to or by any person pursuant to the Articles (other than a notice calling a meeting of the directors) shall be in writing or shall be given using electronic communications to an address for the time being notified for that purpose to the person giving the notice. In these Articles, "Address" in relation to electronic communications, includes a number or address used for the purposes of such communications.

133 A notice may be given by the Company to a Member either personally or by sending it by post in a prepaid envelope addressed to the Member at his registered address or by leaving it at that address or by giving it using electronic communications to an address for the time being notified to the Company by the Member A Member whose registered address is not within the United Kingdom and who gives to the Company an address within the United Kingdom at which notices may be given to him, or an address to which notices may be sent using electronic communications, shall be entitled to have notices given to him at that address, but otherwise no such Member shall be entitled to receive any notice from the Company

134 A Member present, either in person or by proxy, at any meeting of the Company shall be deemed to have received notice of the meeting and, where necessary, of the purposes for which it was called

135 Proof that an envelope containing a notice was properly addressed, prepaid and posted shall be conclusive evidence that the notice was given Proof that a notice contained in an electronic communication was sent in accordance with guidance issued by the Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators shall be conclusive evidence that the notice was given A notice shall be deemed to be given at the expiration of 48 hours after the envelope containing it was posted or, in the case of a notice contained in an electronic communication, at the expiration of 48 hours after the time it was sent

#### INDEMNITY

136 Subject to the provisions of the Companies Act 2006 and Article 6.3 every Director or other officer or auditor of the Company and every member of any Local Governing Body and/or Advisory Body (in so far as necessary) shall be indemnified out of the assets of the Company against any liability incurred by him in that capacity in defending any proceedings, whether civil or criminal, in which judgment is given in favour or in which he is acquitted or in connection with any application in which relief is granted to him by the court from liability for negligence, default, breach of duty or breach of trust in relation to the affairs of the Company

#### **RULES**

- 137 The Directors may from time to time make such rules or bye laws as they may deem necessary or expedient or convenient for the proper conduct and management of the Company and for purposes of prescribing classes of and conditions of membership, and in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, they may by such rules or bye laws regulate
  - a the admission and classification of Members of the Company (including the admission of organisations to membership) and the rights and privileges of such Members, and the conditions of membership and the terms on which Members may resign or have their membership terminated and the entrance fees, subscriptions and other fees or payments to be made by Members,
  - b the conduct of Members of the Company in relation to one another, and to the Company's servants,
  - the setting aside of the whole or any part or parts of the Company's premises at any particular time or times or for any particular purpose or purposes,
  - d the procedure at general meetings and meetings of the Directors

and committees of the Directors and meetings of the Local Governing Bodies in so far as such procedure is not regulated by the Articles, and,

e generally, all such matters as are commonly the subject matter of Company rules

138 The Company in general meeting shall have power to alter, add or to repeal the rules or bye laws and the Directors shall adopt such means as they think sufficient to bring to the notice of Members of the Company all such rules or bye laws, which shall be binding on all Members of the Company Provided that no rule or bye law shall be inconsistent with, or shall affect or repeal anything contained in the Articles

### **AVOIDING INFLUENCED COMPANY STATUS**

Notwithstanding the number of Members from time to time, the maximum aggregate number of votes exercisable by Local Authority Associated Persons shall never exceed 19 9% of the total number of votes exercisable by Members in general meeting and the votes of the other Members having a right to vote at the meeting will be increased on a pro-rata basis

No person who is a Local Authority Associated Person may be appointed as a Director if, once the appointment had taken effect, the number of Directors who are Local Authority Associated Persons would represent 20% or more of the total number of Directors. Upon any resolution put to the Directors, the maximum aggregate number of votes exercisable by any Directors who are Local Authority Associated Persons shall represent a maximum of 19.9% of the total number of votes cast by the Directors on such a resolution and the votes of the other Directors having a right to vote at the meeting will be increased on a pro-rata basis

141 No person who is a Local Authority Associated Person is eligible to be appointed to the office of Director unless his appointment to such office is authorised by the local authority to which he is associated

142 If at the time of either his becoming a Member of the Company or his first appointment to office as a Director any Member or Director was not a Local Authority Associated Person but later becomes so during his membership or tenure as a Director he shall be deemed to have immediately resigned his membership and/or resigned from his office as a Director as the case may be

Authority Associated Persons would (but for Articles 139 to 142 inclusive) represent 20% or more of the total number of Directors or Members (as the case may be) then a sufficient number of the Directors or Members (as the case may be) who are Local Authority Associated Persons shall be deemed to have resigned as Directors or Members (as the case may be) immediately before the occurrence of such an event to ensure that at all times the number of such Directors or Members (as the case may be) is never equal to or greater than 20% of the total number of Directors or Members (as the case may be) Directors or Members (as the case may be) who are Local Authority Associated Persons shall be deemed to have resigned in order of their appointment date the most recently appointed resigning first

144 The Members will each notify the Company and each other if at any time they believe that the Company or any of its subsidiaries has become subject to the influence of a local authority (as described in section 69 of the Local Government and Housing Act) 1989
